Suite 102, *The Link* has been serving the community since January 2023, connecting over 100 kids to services. As a youth assessment center serving ages 6-18, it's a place of support and empowerment for young people, ensuring they have the tools they need to thrive. *The Link* welcomes young people whose parents or guardians recognize their emotional, behavioral, and social struggles, which may include chronic truancy, classroom challenges, substance use, running away from home, traumatic experiences, and mental health concerns among others.



At *The Link*, each young person receives personalized attention and care tailored to their unique circumstances. Trained staff use proven methods to understand the reasons behind the child's struggles. Their goal is to formulate a comprehensive understanding of the young person's situation. This approach ensures effective interventions that consider the multifaceted nature of youth development. The staff recommends and coordinates services for the child and supports the family along the way.

Through collaboration with families, schools, and community resources, *The Link* aims to pave a path towards positive change and growth, empowering youth to navigate life's challenges with resilience and confidence. Hello Jet families! We hope everyone has had a safe and enjoyable summer so far. On behalf of the Fairlawn Board of Education, administration, faculty and staff, we welcome you back to school!

The Fairlawn Local Schools have some familiar faces in new places. We also have a few new staff members this year. Please read the Flyer as we have provided information on our new staff members. Two of our new staff members are our principals. We welcome Mr. Chris Zink as our new elementary principal. Mr. Zink comes to Fairlawn with 26 years of experience in education. We also welcome Mrs. Jessie Geuy as our new middle school / high school principal. Mrs. Geuy comes to Fairlawn with 13 years of experience in education. We are extremely excited to have Mr. Zink and Mrs. Geuy as two of our newest JETS!!

In typical fashion, our excellent maintenance staff has been cleaning the building and preparing it for the return of our students and staff. Thank you to Brent, Todd, Darrick, Kim and Matt for once again making the building look like new.

The district Open House is scheduled for Wednesday, August 14 between 4:00-7:00pm. This is an awesome opportunity to meet our school staff. Our bus routes will be posted in the cafeteria area during this time, so please take a moment to review the pick-up and drop-off times for your bus route. Parents will be able to pay school fees at Open House as well.

One of the goals of the Fairlawn Board of Education for the 2023-2024 school year was to 'Provide a safe and secure campus for our students and staff.' We have made safety upgrades to our facilities during this school year. Some of them include: additional lighting to the area near our ball diamonds and track; installing a fence to the East of our playground for a more secure area, installing outside cameras on our buses (to identify drivers who pass buses with their red lights on), provided each classroom and bus with appropriately stocked safety kits, a new bus purchase (to be delivered in Fall), additional exterior cameras and new key lock boxes on exterior of building for first responders. In addition to upgrades we have made to the exterior of our facilities and buses, we have also made safety and security upgrades to the interior of our main building. The safety of our students, staff and visitors is of paramount importance to the Fairlawn Local Schools.

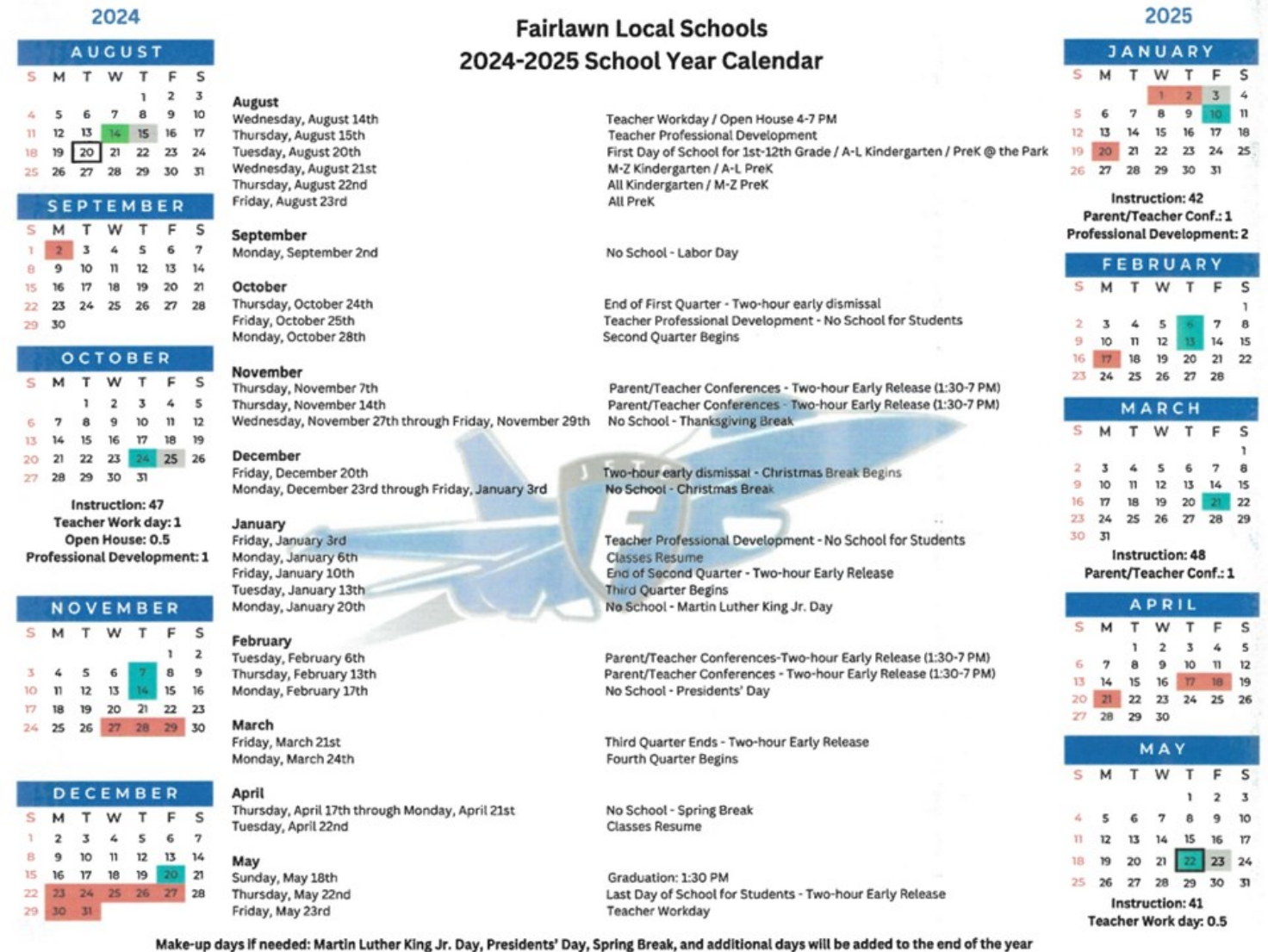


Power 2 Rise
